

DANIEL 10 | Great Conflict in the Latter Days

1 In the third year¹ of Cyrus king of Persia a message (דָּבֶּר) was revealed (גלה) to Daniel, who was named Belteshazzar (בֵּלְטְשֵׁאצֵר). And the message was true (אֲמֶת), and it was a great conflict/tribulation (וְצָּבֵא גָדְׂוֹל).² And he understood (בין) the message and had understanding (בִּינָה) of the vision (מַרְאֵה).

³ **Da 12:5-7** 5 Then I, Daniel, looked, and behold, two others stood, one on this bank of the stream and one on that bank of the stream. 6 And someone said to the man clothed in linen, who was above the waters of the stream, How long shall it be till the end of these wonders? 7 And I heard the man clothed in linen, who was above the waters of the stream. He raised his right hand and his left hand toward heaven and swore by him who lives forever that it would be for a time, times, and half a time, and that when the shattering of the power of the holy people comes to an end all these things would be finished.

⁴ **Re 1:12-16** 12 Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me, and on turning I saw seven golden lampstands, 13 and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man (ὅμοιον τοιὸν ἀνθρώπου), clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash around his chest. 14 The hairs of his head were white, like white wool, like snow. His eyes were like a flame of fire, 15 his feet were like burnished bronze, refined in a furnace, and his voice was like the roar of many waters. 16 In his right hand he held seven stars, from his mouth came a sharp two-edged sword, and his face was like the sun shining in full strength.

speak to you and stand upright, for now I have been sent to you. And when he had spoken this word to me, I stood up trembling. 12 Then he said to me:

Do not fear, Daniel (אַל־תִּירָא דָנִיֵּאלֹי), for from the first day that you set your heart to understand and humbled yourself before your God (אֱלֹהָיךְ לְּבָּנִין וּלְהָתְעַנִּוֹת לְּבָּנִי), your words have been heard, and I have come because of your words. 13 The prince of the kingdom of Persia (וְשֵּׁר מֵלְכָּוֹת פָּרַס) withstood me twenty-one days, but Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me (לְשָׁרִים הָרִאשׁנִים הָּרָאשׁנִים הָּרָאשׁנִים הָּרָאשׁנִים הָרָאשׁנִים בָּא), for I was left there with the kings of Persia (לְשָׁרָרִיִּ שַׁם אֵצֶל מַלְכִי פַּרְס) 14 and came to make you understand what is to happen to your people in the latter days (לְבָּבִינְּהָ בַּאַהַרִית הַנְּמִים). 15 When he had spoken to me according to these words, I turned my face toward the ground and was mute. 16 And behold, one in the likeness of the sons of Adam (וְהַבֵּׁה בִּדְמוּת בְּנֵי אָּדְים) touched my lips. Then I opened my mouth and spoke. I said to him who stood before me:

My lord, by reason of the vision pains have come upon me, and I retain no strength. 17 How can my lord's servant talk with my lord (וְהֵיךְ יוּכַּל עֶבֶד אֲדֹנִי זֶה לְדַבֵּר עִם־אֲדָנִי זֶה)? For now no strength remains in me, and no breath is left in me.

And as he spoke to me, I was strengthened (אַדֹנֵי) and said, Let my lord (אַדֹנֵי) speak, for you have strengthened (תּוֹבִי) me. 20 Then he said:

Do you know why I have come to you? But now I will return to fight against the prince of Persia (שַׂר פַּרֶס). And when I go out, behold, the prince of Greece/Javan (שַׂר־יָיָרָן) will come. 21 But I will tell you what is inscribed in the book of truth (אֶת־הָרְשִׁוּם בִּכְּחָב אֱמֶת). There is none who contends by my side against these except Michael your prince (שַׂרְבֶם מִיּכָאֵל).

And there shall be a time of trouble [the great tribulation], such as never has been since there was a nation [just after the flood] till that time. But at that time your people [Israel] shall be delivered, everyone whose name shall be found written in the book [based on their faith in Messiah Jesus]. **Jud 9** 9 But when the archangel Michael, contending with the devil, was disputing about the body of Moses, he did not presume to pronounce a blasphemous judgment, but said, The Lord rebuke you. **Re 12:7** 7 Now war arose in heaven, Michael and his angels fighting against the dragon. And the dragon and his angels fought back....

Observations

- 1. About the man clothed in linen we learn:
 - a. He is clothed in linen (v. 5).
 - b. He has a belt of fine gold (v. 5).
 - c. His body is like beryl (v. 6).
 - d. His face is like lightning (v. 6).
 - e. His eyes are like flaming torches (v. 6).
 - f. His arms and legs are like bronze (v. 6).
 - g. His words are like the sound of a multitude (v. 6).
 - h. Daniel alone saw him (v. 7).
 - i. Daniel heard the sound of his words (v. 9).
- 2. About the one who touches Daniel we learn:
 - a. He touches Daniel and sets him on his hands and knees (v. 10).
 - b. He has been sent to Daniel (v. 10).
 - c. He has come because of Daniel's words (v. 12).
 - d. The prince of Persia withstood him 21 days (v. 13).
 - e. He is helped by Michael (v. 13).
 - f. He comes to make Daniel understand what is to happen to Israel (v. 14).
 - g. He is in the likeness of man (v. 16, 18).
 - h. He touches Daniel's lips (v. 16).
 - i. Daniel calls him, "my lord" (v. 16).
 - j. Daniel has no strength to talk with him (v. 17).
 - k. He touches and strengthens Daniel (v. 18).
 - 1. He will return to fight against the prince of Persia and the prince of Greece (v. 20).
 - m. He will tell Daniel what is in the book of truth (v. 21).
 - n. Only Michael contends by his side (v. 21).

Lessons for Life

- 1. God wants to communicate to us, but only if we have ears to hear (v. 1).
- 2. We are to set our hearts to understand God and his plan (v. 12).
- 3. We are to have a healthy respect for angels, God's messengers (vv. 7-10).
- 4. We need supernatural strength to receive and understand God's word (vv. 10-11, 18).
- 5. We have the opportunity to know what is inscribed in the book of truth (v. 21). Amazing!
- 6. Like Daniel, we too may become "greatly loved" by God (vv. 11, 19).
- 7. Provided we are in fellowship with God, we are live in his peace without fear (v. 19).
