

VERSES ON JESUS' HUMILITY

2 Samuel 22:36 36 You [Yahweh] have given me [David] the shield of your salvation, and your humiliation (עֲנָה) made me great.

Psalms 18:35 35 You [Yahweh] have given me [David] the shield of your salvation, your right hand supported me, and your humiliation (עֲנָה) made me great.

Psalms 22:6-7 6 ...I [Messiah] am a worm and not a man, scorned by mankind and despised by the people. 7 All who see me mock me. They make mouths at me. They wag their heads.

Isaiah 53:2-3 2 [The Servant] grew up before [God] like a young plant and like a root out of dry ground. He had no form or majesty that we should look at him and no beauty that we should desire him. 3 He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief. And as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

Isaiah 53:7-8 7 [The Servant] was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth. Like a lamb that is led to the slaughter and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth. 8 By oppression and judgment he was taken away. And as for his generation, who considered that he was cut off out of the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people?

Zechariah 9:9 9 Rejoice greatly, daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you. Righteous and having salvation is he, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

Matthew 11:28-29 28 Come to me [Jesus], all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. 29 Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.

Matthew 20:26-28 26 ...Whoever would be great among you must be your servant, 27 and whoever would be first among you must be your slave, 28 even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.

John 1:14 14 ...The Word became flesh and dwelt among us....

John 13:4-5 4 [Jesus] laid aside his outer garments, and taking a towel, tied it around his waist. 5 Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was wrapped around him.

Philippians 2:5-8 5 Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Messiah Jesus, 6 who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7 but emptied himself by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. 8 And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.
