

VERSES ON LOVE

Exodus 20:5-6 5 You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I, Yahweh your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and the fourth generation of those who hate me, 6 but showing loyal love to thousands of those who *love* me and keep my commandments.

Leviticus 19:17-18 17 You shall not hate your brother in your heart, but you shall reason frankly with your neighbor, lest you incur sin because of him. 18 You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against the sons of your own people, but you shall *love* (אהב) your neighbor as yourself: I am Yahweh.

Leviticus 19:33-34 33 When a stranger sojourns with you in your land, you shall not do him wrong. 34 You shall treat the stranger who sojourns with you as the native among you, and you shall love (אהב) him as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt: I am Yahweh your God.

Deuteronomy 6:4-5 4 Hear, O Israel: Yahweh our God, Yahweh is one. 5 You shall *love* Yahweh your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your might.

Deuteronomy 10:18-19 18 [Yahweh] executes justice for the fatherless and the widow, and *loves* the sojourner, giving him food and clothing. 19 *Love* the sojourner, therefore, for you were sojourners in the land of Egypt.

Deuteronomy 30:6 6 And Yahweh your God will circumcise your heart and the heart of your seed, so that you will *love* Yahweh your God with all your heart and with all your soul, that you may live.

Psalm 116:1 1 I *love* Yahweh, because he has heard my voice and my pleas for mercy.

Proverbs 10:12 12 Hatred stirs up strife, but *love* covers all offences.

Matthew 5:43-48 43 You have heard that it was said, You shall <u>love</u> your neighbour and hate your enemy. 44 But I say to you, <u>Love</u> your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, 45 so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. 46 For if you <u>love</u> those who <u>love</u> you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? 47 And if you greet only your brothers, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same? 48 You therefore must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

Matthew 22:35-40 35 And one of them, a lawyer, asked [Jesus] a question to test him. 36 Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Torah? 37 And he said to him, You shall *love* the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. 38 This is the great and first commandment. 39 And a second is like it: You shall *love* your neighbour as yourself. 40 On these two commandments depend all the Torah and the Prophets.



Luke 6:35-36 35 But *love* your enemies, do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return, and your reward will be great, and you will be sons¹ of the Most High, for he is kind to the ungrateful and the evil.

John 5:42 42 But I know that you do not have the *love* of God within you.

John 13:34-35 34 A new commandment I give to you, that you *love* one another. Just as I have *loved* you, you also are to *love* one another. 35 By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have *love* for one another.

John 14:15 15 If you *love* me, you will keep my commandments.

John 15:12-17 12 This is my commandment, that you *love* one another as I have *loved* you. 13 Greater *love* has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. 14 You are my friends if you do what I command you. ...17 These things I command you, so that you will *love* one another.

John 17:26 26 I made known to them your name, and I will continue to make it known, that the *love* with which you have *loved* me may be in them, and I in them.

Romans 5:5 5 ... And hope does not put us to shame, because God's *love* has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.

Romans 12:9-10 9 Let *love* be genuine. Abhor what is evil. Hold fast to what is good. 10 *Love* one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honour.

Romans 13:8-10 8 Owe no one anything, except to <u>love</u> each other, for the one who <u>loves</u> another has fulfilled the Torah. 9 For the commandments, You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet, and any other commandment, are summed up in this word: You shall <u>love</u> your neighbour as yourself. 10 <u>Love</u> does no wrong to a neighbour. Therefore <u>love</u> is the fulfilling of the Torah.

1 Corinthians 8:3 3 But if anyone *loves* (ἀγαπάω, pres.) God, he is known (γινώσκω, perf. pass.) by him.

1 Corinthians 12:31-13:13 31 And I will show you a still more excellent way. 1 If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not *love*, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not *love*, I am nothing. 3 If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not *love*, I gain nothing. 4 *Love* is patient and kind. *Love* does not envy or boast. It is not arrogant 5 or rude. It does not insist on its own way. It is not irritable or resentful. 6 It does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. 7 *Love* bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

¹ We are sons of God, and we act most like sons of God when we love our enemies.



8 *Love* never ends. ...13 So now faith, hope, and *love* abide, these three, but the greatest of these is love.

1 Corinthians 16:14 14 Let all that you do be done in *love*.

1 Corinthians 16:24 24 My *love* be with you all in Messiah Jesus. Amen.

2 Corinthians 2:4 4 ... I wrote to you out of much affliction and anguish of heart and with many tears, not to cause you pain but to let you know the abundant *love* that I have for you.

Galatians 5:6 6 ... In Messiah Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision counts for anything, but only faith working through *love*.

Galatians 5:13-14 13 ... You were called to freedom, brothers and sisters. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through <u>*love*</u> serve one another. 14 For the whole law is fulfilled in one saying: You shall <u>*love*</u> your neighbour as yourself.

Galatians 5:22-23 22 ... The fruit of the Spirit is *love*, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control. Against such things there is no law.

Ephesians 1:15-16 15 ...Because I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your *love* toward all the saints, 16 I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers....

Ephesians 4:15-16 15 ... Speaking the truth in *love*, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Messiah, 16 from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in *love*.

Ephesians 5:2 2 ... Walk in *love*, as Messiah *loved* us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

Colossians 1:3-4 3 We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Messiah, when we pray for you, 4 because we heard of your faith in Messiah Jesus and of the *love* that you have for all the saints....

Colossians 3:14 14 And above all these put on *love*, which binds everything together in perfect harmony.

Philippians 1:9-10 9 ... It is my prayer that your *love* may abound more and more, with knowledge and all discernment, 10 so that you may approve what is excellent, and so be pure and blameless for the day of Messiah....

1 Thessalonians 1:2-3 2 We give thanks to God always for all of you, constantly mentioning you in our prayers, 3 remembering before our God and Father your work of faith, labor of *love*, and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Messiah.



1 Thessalonians **3:12** 12 ... And may the Lord [Jesus] make you increase and abound in *love* for one another and for all, as we do for you....

1 Thessalonians 4:9-10 9 Now concerning *brotherly love* you have no need for anyone to write to you, for you yourselves have been taught by God to *love* one another, 10 for that indeed is what you are doing to all the brothers and sisters throughout Macedonia. But we urge you, brothers and sisters, to do this more and more....

2 Thessalonians 1:3 3 We ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters, as is right, because your faith is growing abundantly, and the *love* of every one of you for one another is increasing.

1 Timothy 1:5 5 The aim of our charge is *love* that issues from a pure heart, a good conscience, and a sincere faith.

Hebrews 6:10 10 For God is not unjust so as to overlook your work and the *love* that you have shown for his name in serving the saints, as you still do.

Hebrews 10:24 24 And let us consider how to stir up one another to *love* and good works....

James 2:8 8 If you really fulfill the royal law according to the Scripture, You shall *love* your neighbour as yourself, you are doing well.

1 Peter 1:22 22 Having purified your souls by your obedience to the truth for a sincere *brotherly love*, *love* one another earnestly from a pure heart....

1 Peter 2:17 17 *Love* the fellowship of believers (ἀδελφότης).

1 Peter 4:8 8 Above all, keep *loving* (ἀγάπη) one another earnestly (πρὸ πάντων τὴν εἰς ἑαυτοὺς ἀγάπην ἐκτενῆ ἔχοντες), because *love* (ἀγάπη) covers a multitude of sins.

1 Peter 5:14 14 Greet one another with the kiss of *love*.

2 Peter 1:5-8 5 ... Make every effort to supplement your faith with virtue, and virtue with knowledge, 6 and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with steadfastness, and steadfastness with godliness, 7 and godliness with *brotherly affection*, and *brotherly affection* with *love*. 8 For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they keep you from being ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Messiah.

1 John 2:15 15 Do not *love* the world or the things in the world. If anyone *loves* the world, the *love* of the Father is not in him.

1 John 3:10-23 10 By this it is evident who are the children of God, and who are the children of the devil: whoever does not practice righteousness is not of God, nor is the one who does not *love* his brother. 11 For this is the message that you have heard from the beginning, that



we should <u>love</u> one another. ...14 We know that we have passed out of death into life, because we <u>love</u> the brothers. Whoever does not <u>love</u> abides in death. 15 Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him. 16 By this we know <u>love</u>, that he laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers. 17 But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's <u>love</u> abide in him? 18 Little children, let us not <u>love</u> in word or talk but in deed and in truth. 19 By this we shall know that we are of the truth and reassure our heart before him. 20 For whenever our heart condemns us, God is greater than our heart, and he knows everything. 21 Beloved, if our heart does not condemn us, we have confidence before God. 22 And whatever we ask we receive from him, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him. 23 And this is his commandment, that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and <u>love</u> one another, just as he has commanded us.

1 John 4:7-21 7 Beloved, let us *love* one another, for *love* is from God, and whoever *loves* has been born of God and knows God. 8 Anyone who does not *love* does not know God, because God is *love*. 9 In this the *love* of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. 10 In this is *love*, not that we have *loved* God but that he *loved* us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. 11 Beloved, if God so *loved* us, we also ought to *love* one another. 12 No one has ever seen God. If we *love* one another, God abides in us and his *love* is perfected in us. 13 By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. 14 And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. 15 Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God. 16 So we have come to know and to believe the *love* that God has for us. God is *love*, and whoever abides in *love* abides in God, and God abides in him. 17 By this is *love* perfected with us, so that we may have confidence for the day of judgment, because as he is so also are we in this world. 18 There is no fear in *love*, but perfect *love* casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not been perfected in *love*. 19 We *love* because he first *loved* us. 20 If anyone says, I love God, and hates his brother, he is a liar, for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot *love* God whom he has not seen. 21 And this commandment we have from him: whoever *loves* God must also *love* his brother.

1 John 5:1-3 1 Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Messiah has been born of God, and everyone who *loves* the Father *loves* whoever has been born of him. 2 By this we know that we *love* the children of God, when we *love* God and obey his commandments. 3 For this is the *love* of God, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome [if we are empowered by his Spirit].

2 John 5-6 5 And now I ask you, dear lady—not as though I were writing you a new commandment, but the one we have had from the beginning—that we *love* one another. 6 And this is *love*, that we walk according to his commandments. This is the commandment, just as you have heard from the beginning, so that you should walk in it.
