

VERSES ON MOSAIC LAW

Exodus 20:3-17 3 You shall have no other gods before me. 4 You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. 5 You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I, Yahweh your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and the fourth generation of those who hate me, 6 but showing loyal love to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments. 7 You shall not take the name of Yahweh your God in vain, for Yahweh will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain. 8 Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. 9 Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, 10 but the seventh day is a Sabbath to Yahweh your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. 11 For in six days Yahweh made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore Yahweh blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. 12 Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long in the land that Yahweh your God is giving you. 13 You shall not murder. 14 You shall not commit adultery. 15 You shall not steal. 16 You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour. 17 You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, his male servant, his female servant, his ox, his donkey, or anything that is your neighbour's.

Exodus 31:18 18 And [Yahweh] gave to Moses, when he had finished speaking with him on Mount Sinai, the two tablets of the testimony, tablets of stone, written with the finger of God.

Exodus 34:1 1 Yahweh said to Moses, Cut for yourself two tablets of stone like the first, and I will write on the tablets the words that were on the first tablets, which you broke.

Leviticus 18:3-5 3 You shall not do as they do in the land of Egypt, where you lived, and you shall not do as they do in the land of Canaan, to which I am bringing you. You shall not walk in their statutes. 4 You shall follow my rules and keep my statutes and walk in them. I am Yahweh your God. 5 You shall therefore keep my statutes and my rules. If a person does them, he shall live by them. I am Yahweh.

Deuteronomy 4:8 8 And what great nation is there, that has statutes and rules so righteous as all this law that I [Moses] set before you today?

Deuteronomy 4:37-40 40 Therefore you shall keep [Yahweh's] statutes and his commandments, which I [Moses] command you today, that it may go well with you and with your children after you, and that you may prolong your days in the land that Yahweh your God is giving you for all time.

Deuteronomy 6:1-5 1 Now this is the commandment—the statutes and the rules—that the Lord your God commanded me to teach you, that you may do them in the land to which you are going over, to possess it, 2 that you may fear the Lord your God, you and your son and your son's son, by keeping all his statutes and his commandments, which I command you, all the days of your life, and that your days may be long. 3 Hear therefore, O Israel, and be

careful to do them, that it may go well with you, and that you may multiply greatly, as Yahweh, the God of your fathers, has promised you, in a land flowing with milk and honey. 4 Hear, O Israel: Yahweh our God, Yahweh is one. 5 You shall love Yahweh your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your might.

Deuteronomy 6:24 24 And Yahweh commanded us to do all these statutes, to fear Yahweh our God, for our good always, that he might preserve us alive, as we are this day.

Deuteronomy 27:26 26 Cursed be anyone who does not confirm the words of this law by doing them. And all the people shall say, Amen.

Nehemiah 9:13 13 You came down on Mount Sinai and spoke with them from heaven and gave them right rules and true laws, good statutes and commandments....

Psalm 119:97 97 Oh how I love your law! It is my meditation all the day.

Ezekiel 20:11 11 I gave them my statutes and made known to them my rules, by which, if a person does them, he shall live.

Ezekiel 20:25-26 25 Moreover, I gave them statutes that were not good and rules by which they could not have life, 26 and I defiled them through their very gifts in their offering up all their firstborn, that I might devastate them. I did it that they might know that I am Yahweh.

Matthew 5:17-20 17 Do not think that I [Jesus] have come to abolish (καταλύω) the Law or the Prophets. I have not come to abolish them but to fulfil them. 18 For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. 19 Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. 20 For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

Matthew 5:21-22 21 You have heard that it was said to those of old, You shall not murder, and whoever murders will be liable to judgment. 22 But I say to you....

Matthew 19:16-22 16 And behold, a man came up to him, saying, Teacher, what good deed must I do to have eternal life? 17 And he said to him, Why do you ask me about what is good? There is only one who is good. If you would enter life, keep the commandments. 18 He said to him, Which ones? And Jesus said, You shall not murder, You shall not commit adultery, You shall not steal, You shall not bear false witness, 19 Honor your father and mother, and, You shall love your neighbour as yourself. 20 The young man said to him, All these I have kept. What do I still lack? 21 Jesus said to him, If you would be perfect, go, sell what you possess and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. And come, follow me. 22 When the young man heard this he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions.

John 1:17 17 For the law was given through Moses. Grace and truth came through Jesus Messiah.

John 7:19 19 Has not Moses given you the law? Yet none of you keeps the law. Why do you seek to kill me?

Acts 13:39 39 By [Jesus] everyone who believes is freed from everything from which you could not be freed by the law of Moses.

Acts 21:20-21 20 And they said to [Paul], You see, brother, how many thousands there are among the Jews of those who have believed. They are all zealous for the law, 21 and they have been told about you that you teach all the Jews who are among the Gentiles to forsake Moses, telling them not to circumcise their children or walk according to our customs.

Romans 2:14 14 For when Gentiles, who do not have the law, by nature do what the law requires, they are a law to themselves, even though they do not have the law.

Romans 3:19-20 19 Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. 20 For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, because through the law comes knowledge of sin.

Romans 3:31 31 Do we then overthrow the law by this faith? By no means! On the contrary, we uphold the law.

Romans 5:13 13 ...Sin indeed was in the world before the law was given, but sin is not counted where there is no law.

Romans 5:20 20 The law came in to increase the trespass, but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more.

Romans 7:4-14 4 My brothers and sisters, you...have died to the *law* through the body of Messiah, so that you may belong to another, to him who has been raised from the dead, in order that we may produce fruit for God. 5 For while we were living in the flesh, our sinful passions, aroused by the *law*, were at work in our members to produce fruit for death. 6 But now we are released from the *law*, having died to that which held us captive, so that we serve in the new way of the Spirit and not in the old way of the *written code*. 7 What then shall we say? That the *law* is sin? By no means! Yet if it had not been for the *law*, I would not have known sin. For I would not have known what it is to covet if the *law* had not said, You shall not covet. 8 But sin, seizing an opportunity through the *commandment*, produced in me all kinds of covetousness. For apart from the *law*, sin lies dead. 9 I was once alive apart from the *law*, but when the *commandment* came, sin came alive, and I died. 10 The very *commandment* that promised life proved to be death to me. 11 For sin, seizing an opportunity through the *commandment*, deceived me and through it killed me. 12 So the *law* is holy, and the *commandment* is holy, righteous, and good. 13 Did that which is good, then, bring death to me? By no means! It was sin, producing death in me through what is good, in order that sin

might be shown to be sin, and through the commandment might become sinful beyond measure. 14 For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am of the flesh, sold under sin.

Romans 8:3-7 3 For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do. By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, 4 in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. ... 7 For the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God, for it does not submit to God's law. Indeed, it cannot.

Romans 9:30-10:5 30 What shall we say, then? That Gentiles who did not pursue righteousness have attained it, that is, a righteousness that is by faith, 31 but that Israel who pursued a law that would lead to righteousness did not succeed in reaching that law. 32 Why? Because they did not pursue it by faith, but as if it were based on works. They have stumbled over the stumbling stone, 33 as it is written, Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone of stumbling, and a rock of offense. And whoever believes in him will not be put to shame. 1 Brothers and sisters, my heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved. 2 For I bear them witness that they have a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge. 3 For, being ignorant of the righteousness of God, and seeking to establish their own, they did not submit to God's righteousness. 4 For Messiah is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes. 5 For Moses writes about the righteousness that is based on the law, that the person who does the commandments shall live by them.

Romans 13:9 9 For the commandments, You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet, and any other commandment, are summed up in this statement: You shall love your neighbour as yourself.

2 Corinthians 3:6 6 ...Who has made us sufficient to be ministers of a new covenant, not of the letter but of the Spirit. For the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.

2 Corinthians 3:17 17 Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom [from the requirements of the Mosaic law].

Galatians 2:16 16 We know that a person is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Messiah. So we also have believed in Messiah Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Messiah and not by works of the law, because by works of the law no one will be justified.

Galatians 3:10-13 10 All who rely on works of the law are under a curse. For it is written, Cursed be everyone who does not abide by all things written in the Book of the Law and do them. 11 Now it is evident that no one is justified before God by the law, for: The righteous shall live by faith. 12 But the law is not of faith, rather: The one who does them shall live by them. 13 Messiah redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us—for it is written: Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree.

Galatians 3:19-26 19 Why then the law? It was added because of transgressions, until the seed should come to whom the promise had been made, and it was put in place through

angels by an intermediary. ...21 Is the *law* then contrary to the promises of God? Certainly not! For if a *law* had been given that could give life, then righteousness would indeed be by the *law*. 22 But the Scripture imprisoned everything under sin, so that the promise by faith in Jesus Messiah might be given to those who believe. 23 Now before [the object of] faith came, we were held captive under the *law*, imprisoned until the coming [object of] faith would be revealed. 24 So then, the *law* was our guardian until Messiah came, in order that we might be justified by faith. 25 But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian, 26 for in Messiah Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith.

Galatians 5:1-4 1 For freedom Messiah has set us free. Stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. 2 Look: I, Paul, say to you that if you accept circumcision, Messiah will be of no advantage to you. 3 I testify again to every man who accepts circumcision that he is obligated to keep the whole *law*. 4 You are severed from Messiah, you who would be justified by the law. You have fallen away from grace.

Galatians 5:14 14 For the whole *law* is fulfilled in one statement: You shall love your neighbour as yourself.

Galatians 5:22-23 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control. Against such things there is no *law*.

1 Timothy 1:8-10 8 Now we know that the *law* is good, if one uses it lawfully, 9 understanding this, that the *law* is not laid down for the just but for the lawless and disobedient, for the ungodly and sinners, for the unholy and profane, for those who strike their fathers and mothers, for murderers, 10 the sexually immoral, men who practice homosexuality, enslavers, liars, perjurers, and whatever else is contrary to sound doctrine....

James 2:10 10 Whoever keeps the whole *law* but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it.
